WHY SHOULD I SIGN UP FOR THE ASSISTANTSHIP AWARD?

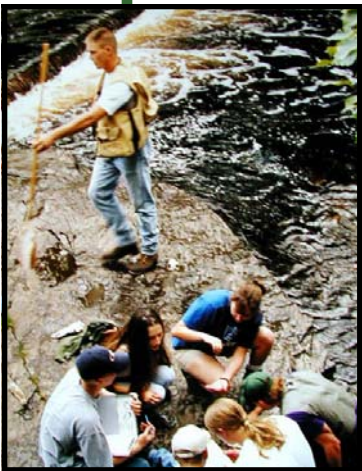
